

The Pills I Take

All pills affect the body, that is why we take them, but many can actually cause problems when you are undergoing surgery. The most common problem is reduced blood clotting which can mean difficulty stopping bleeding, increased bruising, and delayed healing. More serious problems can be high blood pressure, cardiovascular concerns and interactions with anesthesia medications.

If you take any pills – prescriptions, over-the-counter, vitamins or herbs – make sure that you give a complete list to Dr. Moynihan so that he can make the appropriate decision regarding their safety. A list of Medications to Avoid is available for your convenient reference at home while preparing for surgery. It is thorough, but not comprehensive, as new drugs are released regularly. Please call the office, or your pharmacy, if you feel the need to take anything not on the list and not previously indicated as safe.
